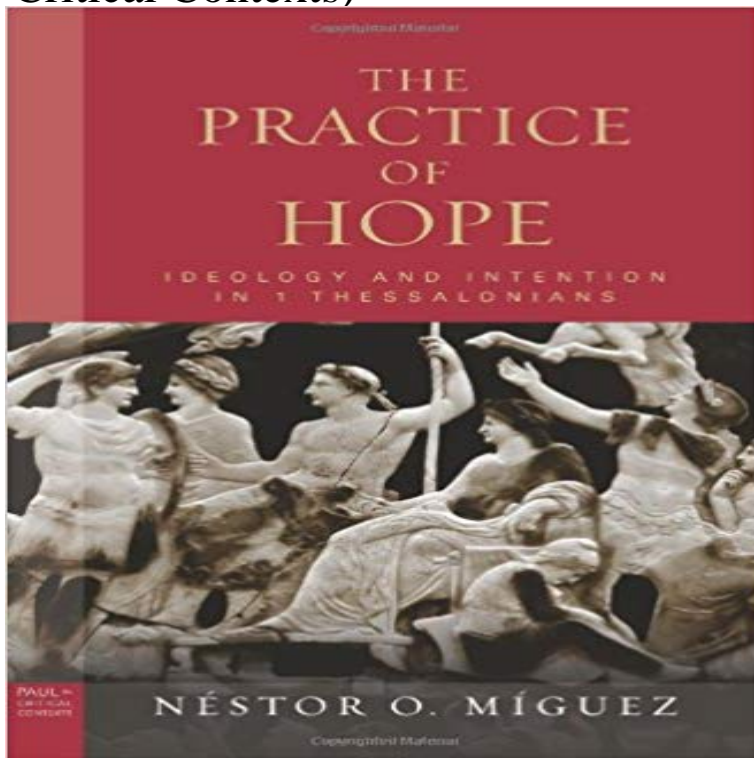


The Practice of Hope: Ideology and Intention in 1 Thessaionians (Paul in Critical Contexts)
