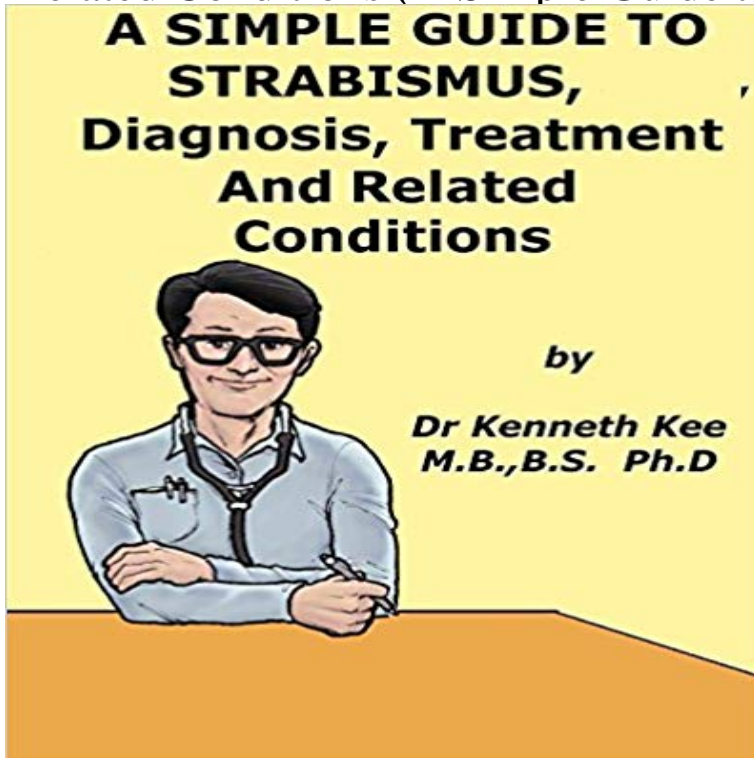


A Simple Guide To Strabismus (Squint), Diagnosis, Treatment And Related Conditions (A Simple Guide to Medical Conditions)



Squint A squint can affect visual acuity as well as the appearance of a child or adult. I had a clinic assistant who had a squint in her right eye which appeared as though she was secretly looking at you. Because of that appearance she had difficulty in finding work. Knowing that the squint was not her fault, I employed her to help out in the clinic work. She had no problem in doing clinic work. She also had problem getting a husband. Her mother used to match mate her with many men but all rejected her. Later when the clinic had a branch in Plaza Singapura, being one of the senior clinic assistant she was sent to help my partner Dr Tan at the branch. A Squint or strabismus is a condition where the two eyes are misaligned (Cross-eyed). A squint is a medical condition where the eyes are not looking together in the same direction. The other eye turns to look inwards, outwards, upwards or downwards while one eye looks straight ahead. Squints are common in children affecting about 1 in 20 children. This eye disorder can occur at any age. Any one can notice when the baby has a squint. Most squints occur before the child's preschool age which is when a child is three years old. Squints can also occur in older children or in adults. Squint or strabismus can cause reduced binocular or stereo (3D) vision, and children with strabismus can have a lazy eye (amblyopia). What are the types of Squints? Types of Squint: Squints can be

divided into different types: 1. By the direction of the squinting (turning) eye: a. An eye that turns inwards is called an esotropia. b. An eye that turns outwards is called an exotropia. c. An eye that turns upwards is called a hypertropia. d. An eye that turns downwards is called a hypotropia. 2. Presence of the Squint a. Whether the squint is present all the time (constant), b. Whether it comes and goes (intermittent). 3. The turning of the Affected Eye a. Whether the affected eye turns when the eyes are open and being used (manifest squint) b. Whether the eye turns only when it is covered or shut (latent squint), but the affected eye looks fine with the eyes that are open. 4. Whether the severity (angle) of the squint is the same in all directions or not: a. A concomitant squint means that the angle (degree) of the squint is always the same in every direction that you look. In other words, the two eyes move together, all the muscles are moving, but the two eyes are always not in alignment by the same degree, no matter the direction you look. b. An incomitant squint means that the angle of squint can vary. An example is there may be no squint and the eyes are aligned when you look to the left. The moment you look to the right, the movement of one eye may not be far and the eyes are then not aligned. 5. By age of onset. Development of most squints occurs in the first three years of life. Rarely in older children and adults, squints may develop. Squints developing in children typically have causes that are different to those developing in adults. 6. By the cause: a. The cause of development of a squint develops is not known in many cases of childhood squint. b. In some cases of childhood squint (and most adult squint), the squint occurs because of an abnormal condition of the eye, the brain, the eye muscles or the nerves.
