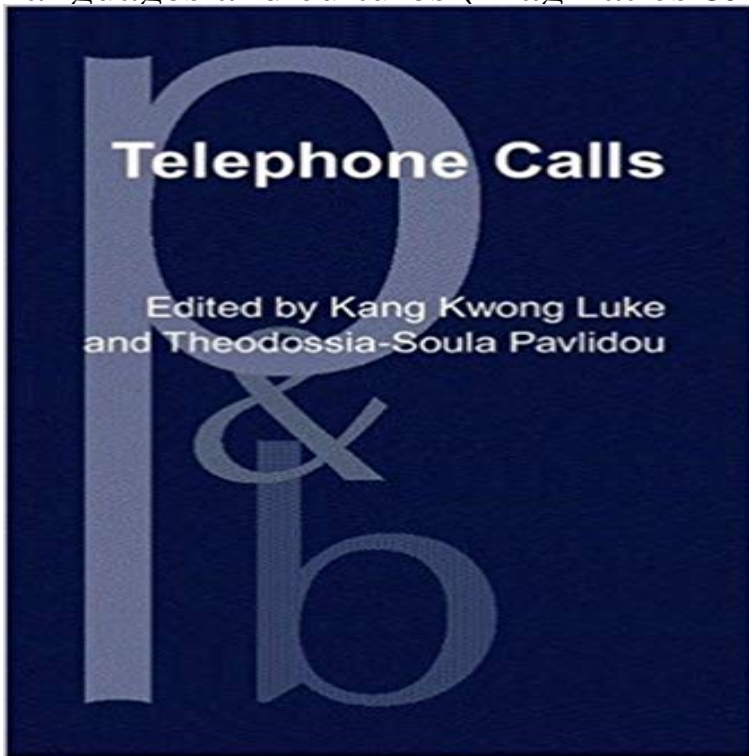


Telephone Calls: Unity and diversity in conversational structure across languages and cultures (Pragmatics & Beyond New Series)
