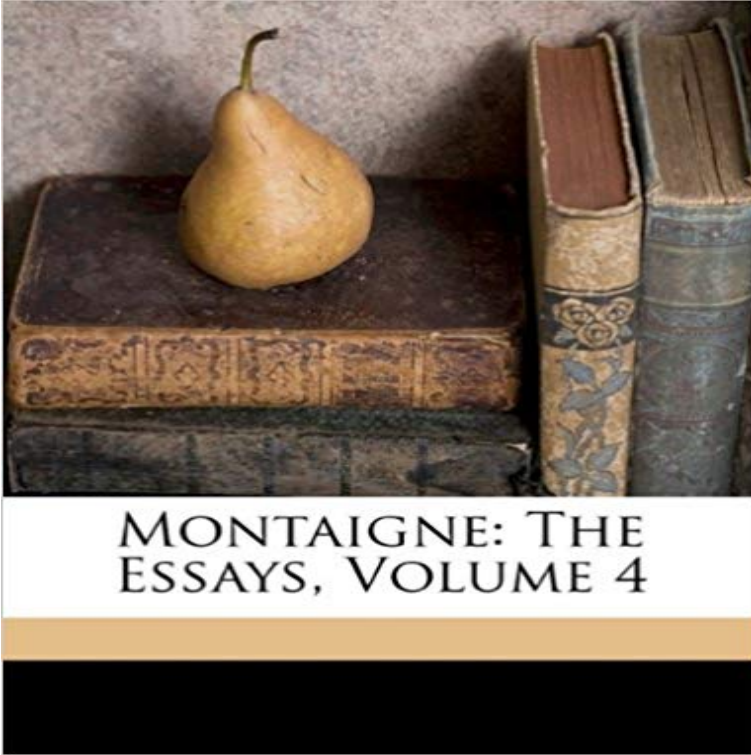


Montaigne: The Essays, Volume 4 (Scots Edition)
