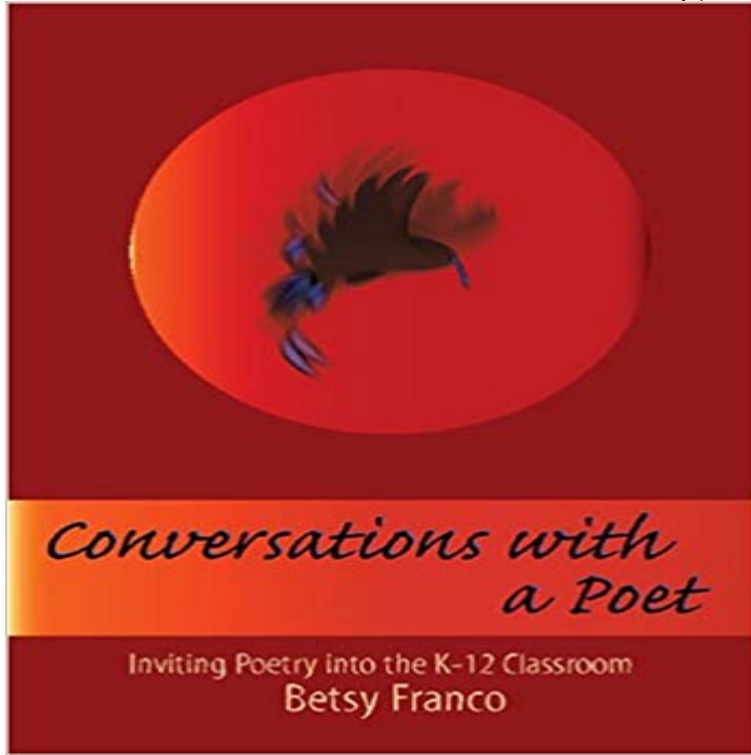


Conversations With a Poet: Inviting Poetry into K-12 Classrooms
