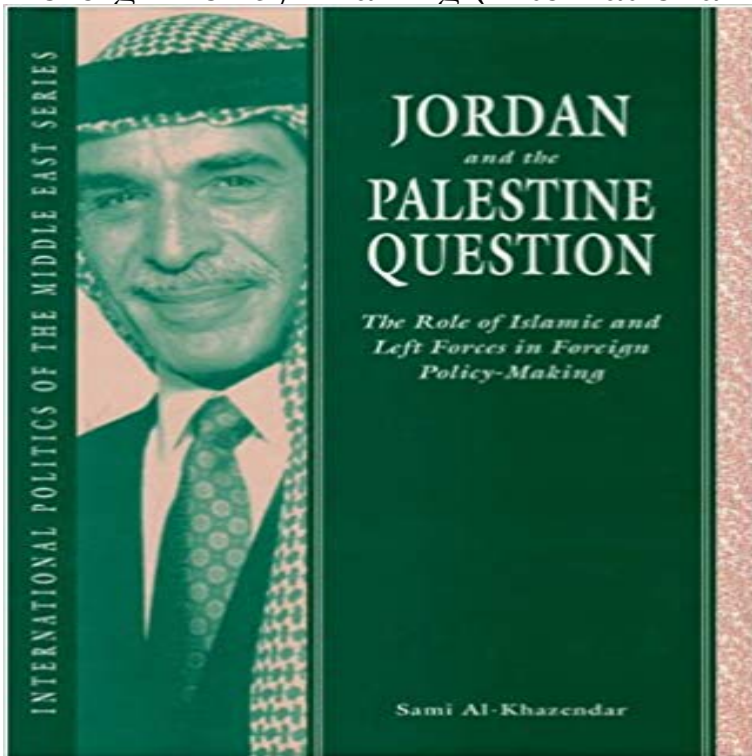


Jordan and the Palestine Question: The Role of Islamic and left Forces in Foreign Policy-Making (International Politics of the Middle East)
